

European Senior Championships

The European Championship in 1910 was the first official championship organized by LIHG. A World Championships acted simultaneously as European Championship (except 1920, 1924 and 1932). The last separate European Championships took place in 1932. Since 1992 no longer held. 1963 - 1966 and 1969 onwards only games played among European teams counted for ranking of European Senior Championships.

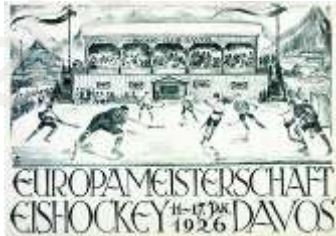
